**READ**

Isaiah 9:6-7

**REFLECT**

When Isaiah uses the word “government”, it is a very unique reference to the kingdom that God will setup on earth through Jesus. And it is a kingdom that will be characterized by the four names given to Jesus in Is 9:6 — wise, godly leadership, power, father heart of God, and peace. Today we focus in on “Mighty God”.

God demonstrates his power in certain ways. Here are 5 ways:

**1. SUPERNATURAL MIRACLES**

*In the sight of their fathers he performed wonders in the land of Egypt. (Ps 78:12)*

Jesus demonstrated a kingdom full of signs, wonders and miracles.

**2. SUPERNATURAL DELIVERANCE AND SALVATION**

*He divided the sea and let them pass through it, and made the waters stand like a heap. (Ps 78:13)*

Jesus brought healing, deliverance and salvation to those around him.

**3. SUPERNATURAL GUIDANCE**

*In the daytime he led them with a cloud, and all the night with a fiery light. (Ps 78:14)*

Jesus called people to follow him and to embrace his perspective of life and way of living.

**4. SUPERNATURAL REFRESHING**

*He split rocks in the wilderness and gave them drink abundantly as from the deep. He made streams come out of the rock and caused waters to flow down like rivers. (Ps 78:15-16)*

Jesus invites us to come to him to be refreshed.

**5. SUPERNATURAL PROVISION**

Read Ps 78:23-29

Jesus never lacked any resource to fulfill his call to God. God is for (pro) his vision!
