AWSOME GOD Pt 1: Jehovah

INTRO

READ

Exodus 3:13-15; John 8:56-59; John 18:4-6

REFLECT/RESPOND

God uses circumstances, not just messages, to move us in three ways:

- Less self-reliant
- More grateful
- More dependent on Him

Qu: Can you share a current situation in your life where you suppose God is using difficult circumstances to change you in one of these three areas?

The encounter Moses had with God recorded in this passage from Exodus was the first time in the Bible God revealed His name.

YHWH / Jehovah / Yahweh / LORD

Meaning: "the unchanging, eternal, self-existent God"

I am that I am.

While we do not know how to pronounce the four Hebrew letters of the name of God, we do know the bigger thing that God wanted Moses to know, namely, that He is the unchanging, eternal, selfexistent God.

It's also important to understand that Jesus is this same unchanging, eternal, self-existing God as the passages from John reveal. Even though Moses had this amazing personal encounter with God at the burning bush where He became the first person to receive this level of revelation about God, Moses still struggled to live with this understanding in his heart. As we see Moses move forward to be the leader and deliverer that God called him to be, there were many expressions of doubt along the way even when God performed incredible signs.

We are no different than Moses even with all the understanding we have about God.

Qu: Why do you think it so difficult to practically trust God even though we have the knowledge that the unchanging, eternal, self-existing God is with us?
