# Conversion & Partnership: God's work & ours

God intervenes in Cornelius' life in dramatic supernatural fashion. And yet, God also uses Peter to bring Cornelius to a place of faith in Jesus.

### A lifetime of Conversion

Acts reminds us that conversions are stories about beginnings, the beginning of the Christian journey, not its final destination; a reminder that change is meant to be ongoing throughout our lives.

This is a story about 2 equally significant conversions needed to advance God's mission: Cornelius to Christ and Peter's need to be converted in his thinking, specifically out of his prejudice towards gentiles. "Though conversion may be pinpointed to a moment, salvation is a process that continues over a lifetime. I am still being saved from old ways of thinking and behaving and am coming to new understandings, to new life."
