How did a small religious movement among rural Jews spread across the Roman Empire, causing upheaval and spiritual transformation wherever it went? That is the very question Luke, the author of the book of <u>Acts</u>, is trying to answer. — Bible Project

Now the **company of believers** was of one heart and soul.. — Acts 4:32a AMP

We see in Acts 16 throughout the Book of Acts, God draws together a diverse group of people to build his church and to fulfill the directive of Jesus to take his good news into all the world. In this chapter, Paul begins his 2nd missionary journey, heading to what is today Europe. Here's who we meet along the way

- Timothy, a very young man, the son of a Greek dad and Jewish mom
- Luke, a Greek, a physician, and the only Gentile (non-Jew) to write any portion of the New Testament (The Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles)

- Lydia, a wealthy and influential Asian business woman who may have been the first Gentile covert to Christianity in Europe, and the first church meets in her home!
- An unnamed slave girl, likely between the ages of 10 & 14, miraculously delivered from a spirit that had held its grip on her
- A Philippian jailor, a former Roman soldier, with a brutal past believes, is baptized and radically changed

When Paul and Silas were released from prison and before they depart on their journey,

"...they went to Lydia's house, where they met with the brothers and sisters and encouraged them. Then they left." verse 40
