# Faithfulness in Waiting

Despite their pain, Elizabeth and Zechariah continued to serve God faithfully. God's intervention in their lives shows that His timing is perfect, even when it doesn't align with ours.

Qu: How do you think Elizabeth and Zechariah were able to remain faithful despite years of waiting?

What does faithfulness in waiting look like for you personally?

### God's Faithfulness

God not only answered Elizabeth's prayer but included her in His larger redemptive plan for humanity. Her response magnified God's faithfulness and removed her disgrace, showing that waiting is never wasted in God's hands.

Qu: Have you experienced a time when God's faithfulness became evident after a long season of waiting?

### **APPLICATION**

**Reflect**: Spend time this week identifying one area of waiting in your life. Journal or pray about what it means to trust God in that space.

**Practice**: Commit to a specific act of faithfulness in your waiting, such as deepening your prayer life, serving in a ministry, or supporting others in their seasons of waiting.

**Hope**: As a group, commit to praying for one another's unmet longings, trusting that God is at work even when we don't see immediate answers.
