- Have you ever longed for justice in a situation where you or someone you love was wronged?
- How do you respond to the idea of judgment—fear or hope?

READ

Revelation 6:1–2, 9–11, 15–17

Revelation 7:1–4

Revelation 8:1–5

Leader's Note: This is a longer discussion guide, so feel free to focus on just one of the chapters, concluding points, and questions, depending on your group's time and engagement.

REFLECT

Chapter 6 – A Broken World

- *The Four Horsemen* show a world already in crisis without God.
- *The Martyrs* cry out “How long?”—God says, *justice is coming, but not rushed.*
- *The Sixth Seal* shows cosmic upheaval—earthly powers are shaken.

Concluding Point: The world and my life are more broken than I ever imagined—so I must trust God's timeline.

Qu: Where in your life do you struggle to trust God's timing when things feel unjust or chaotic?

Chapter 7 – God's Sealed People

- *144,000 Sealed*—God protects His people spiritually, not from hardship but for Himself.
- *Multitude in White*—a global vision of people preserved *through* suffering, now worshipping.

Concluding Point: *Being sealed doesn't mean I won't suffer—it means I belong to God.*

Qu: How does knowing you belong to God help you endure suffering?

Chapter 8 – Silence and Prayer

- *Silence in Heaven*—God pauses, taking justice seriously.
- *Prayers Rise*—Our cries are part of God's plan to set things right.

Concluding Point: *God hears my prayers—they matter in His justice.*

Qu: What would change about your prayer life if you truly believed every prayer helps bring God's justice?

RESPOND

- Where do you need to trust God's justice more deeply?
- How does knowing you are sealed affect how you endure suffering?
- What injustice are you praying about right now?

PRAY

- For courage to endure injustice.
- For confidence that God hears your prayers.
- For trust in His unfolding justice.
- For any needs that group members have
