READ

Revelation 4:8-11

Revelation 5:9-14

Picture the setting and feel the weight of the worship described.

What stands out to you about the throne room scene in Revelation 4 and 5?

Qu: What imagery or phrases stir your imagination or heart?

Qu: Who is on the throne, and what does it reveal about God's character and power?

REFLECT

...the twenty-four elders fall down before him who sits on the throne and worship him who lives for ever and ever. They lay their crowns before the throne and say: "You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honour and power, for you created all things, and by your will they were created and have their being." — Revelation 4:10-11

NT Wright says, "This is the heart of worship: surrendering our own authority and glory."

Qu: In what areas of your life are you still "holding onto your crown"?

Qu: What would it look like to surrender that area in worship?

The crowd around the throne represents people "from every tribe and language." (Rev 5:9, 7:9)

Qu: What does this picture of people from every nation worshiping together reveal about God's heart for the Church—and your part in it?

RESPOND

Revelation offers timeless and timely help by anchoring our faith, fuelling our hope, and renewing our purpose—even in times of uncertainty. Revelation reminds us

- God is holy, eternal, and actively reigning.
- This vision reminds us that Jesus' sacrifice has secured the final victory.
- Our purpose is reawakened —not to merely get by, but to actively participate in God's redemptive work in the world.

Qu: What is one intentional step you can take this week to anchor your faith, fuel your hope, or renew your sense of purpose?
