READ

Hebrews 3:7-13; 4:1-2, 9-11

REFLECT & RESPOND

Hebrews is a sermon that shows us that Jesus is superior to anything we might trust in. Today, we'll see how He offers a true rest for our souls...

1. The Problem of Restlessness

Augustine said, "You have made us for Yourself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they rest in You."

Q: Where have you tried to find rest that's left you feeling more restless?

2. The Tragedy of Unbelief

Read Heb 4:2 again. Like Israel, unbelief keeps us from entering God's promised rest when we hesitate to trust and obey Him.

Q: Have you ever hesitated to obey God, even when you believed He was leading you? What held you back?

3. The Promise of Rest

God offers rest, a Sabbath-rest that frees us from self-reliance and restores our relationship with Him.

Q: How does this kind of rest differ from ordinary rest?

4. The Invitation of Christ

In Mt 11:28, Jesus' invitation to rest is for us to come closer to him.

Q: Practically, what does it mean to 'come to Jesus' for you? In what ways could you grow in this?

5. The Call to Faithfulness

We are to "make every effort" to enter God's rest (4:11). This is a call to be faithfulness. Faithfulness includes Christ-centred focus, active obedience, a tender heart, urgency of today, and shared perseverance.

Q: Which area of faithfulness do you find easiest or hardest, and which area do you need to focus on right now?

Through Jesus, we are invited to live *from* rest, not chase *after* it.

Q: How can this understanding of rest change the way you approach your work, relationships, and spiritual life?

PRAY

- Surrender Restlessness: Ask God to reveal areas where you've been trying to find rest apart from Him.
- Trust and Obedience: Pray for courage to step out in faith and obey God's leading, even when it feels risky.
- Experience God's Rest: Invite the Holy Spirit to help you live from His rest, not chase after temporary fixes.
- Faithfulness in Community: Pray for encouragement and perseverance as you walk with others in faith.
