READ

Gen 12:1-4 (Abram)

Gen 26:1-6,12-14 (Isaac)

Gen 28:1-6, 31:3 (Jacob)

Ruth 1:1-6 (Elimelech, Naomi, Ruth)

REFLECT & RESPOND

Where you live, work, and settle can affect your destiny. The critical question is not where is better, but what is God saying to me?

Abram: Called to Leave

God asked him to leave familiarity. Obedience led to blessing, not comfort.

Q: How do you discern the difference between a faith-filled move and a fear-based one?

Insight: Moving is not about chasing a better life, but aligning with God's purpose.

Issac: Called to Stay

Isaac faced famine, but God told him not to leave. Staying led to unexpected abundance.

Q: When have you felt pressure to change location or career because of external conditions?

Q: Why is "staying" sometimes harder than "going"?

Insight: Prosperity flows from obedience, not geography.

Jacob: Sent Away, Then Called Back

His move met a relational purpose, but God later called him to return.

Q: How do you know when a season is ending, and what helps you remain sensitive to God's changing direction?

Insight: A God-given season can turn into a delay if we refuse to listen.

Elimelech & Naomi: A Move Made in Fear

They left due to famine, but without God's leading.

Q: What fears typically influence people's relocation decisions? How should we reframe these fears in light of our faith?

Insight: A new place, city or even country can look appealing but still be spiritually costly.

Personal Application:

- What is influencing my current desire to stay or go—faith, fear, comfort, pressure?
- Have I taken time to ask God for direction in this area?
- Is there a past relocation where I need healing or perspective?
- What from these stories challenges your thinking?
